The Board has previously expressed an interest in participating in the SR 28 Corridor Study.

The study would prepare an economic market study to estimate future travel demand. The study would also develop a planning-level cost estimate to expand SR 28 from two lanes to four lanes (City of Rock Island to Interstate 90).

The Port's contribution would be \$10,000 and be funded from the Regional Port's "Other Professional Service" budget line item that has a \$40,000 allocation for 2022.

Hello Jim and Pat:

It took some time to finalize the scope/budget for the SR 28 Corridor Study contract supplement that you've agreed to help us fund ... attached is a draft ILA that represents our mutual financial contributions. For your awareness, the \$232,923 this document shows as the amount CDTC is spending includes a roughly \$40,000 contribution WSDOT is making through a separate agreement we have with the state. CDTC in actuality will expend \$190,000, I've just included WSDOT's contribution in our funding commitment figure for purposes of this ILA, since the state isn't party to this ILA.

I don't have a staff contact for Port of Quincy so please forward this to the appropriate person on their end. The format and scope matches previous ILAs we've entered into with local municipalities for similar studies, but I'm flexible on content adjustments/corrections as needed per your review.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made between **Chelan-Douglas Transportation Council (CDTC)**, and the **Chelan-Douglas Regional Port Authority (CDRPA)**, the **City of Quincy** and the **Port of Quincy** (known collectively as Participating Entities) for the purpose of sharing costs to conduct a transportation planning study.

RECITALS:

A. The Interlocal Cooperation Act, RCW 39.34, authorizes public agencies to enter into agreements with one another for cooperative action. The CDTC, CDRPA, City of Quincy and Port of Quincy qualify as public agencies for purposes of RCW 39.34.

B. The CDTC, CDRPA, City of Quincy and Port of Quincy desire to work together on the following described project for the benefit of the region. CDTC is serving as the lead agency to conduct a transportation planning study to evaluate safety and capacity improvements to the SR 28 highway corridor between East Wenatchee and Interstate 90. The CDRPA, City of Quincy and Port of Quincy desire to contribute funding toward to cost of the transportation planning study.

C. CDTC will administer the agreement through a supplement to a preexisting contract with Perteet.

D. The total cost of the transportation planning study including the supplement for the tasks described below in AGREEMENT sections 4.a and 4.b is \$252,923.

E. The total combined amount of funding to be contributed CDRPA, City of Quincy and the Port of Quincy is \$20,000, with individual shares itemized below in this Agreement.

F. Through this Interlocal Agreement, CDTC, CDRPA, the City of Quincy and the Port of Quincy desire to proceed with the transportation planning study and to fairly allocate the cost between them.

AGREEMENT:

In consideration of the terms that this Interlocal Agreement contains, CDTC, CDRPA, the City of Quincy and the Port of Quincy agree as follows:

1. Term. This Agreement shall be deemed effective on recording with the Douglas County Auditor and Grant County Auditor. It shall terminate upon completion of the transportation planning study, or no later than June 30, 2022.

2. Administration of Agreement. Jeff Wilkens, CDTC Executive Director, shall administer this Agreement. The designated representative of each Participating Entity shall be responsible to report to their respective governing body.

4. Purpose. The purpose of this Interlocal Agreement is to accomplish a transportation planning study to evaluate safety and capacity improvements to the SR 28 highway corridor between East Wenatchee and Interstate 90 that includes the following specific consultant tasks:

a) to prepare an economic market study and development forecast for the SR 28 highway corridor to include the Wenatchee Valley and City of Quincy for purposes of estimating future travel demand on SR 28; and

b) to develop a planning-level cost estimate to expand SR 28 from two lanes to four lanes between the City of Rock Island to City of Quincy, and to expand SR 281 from two lanes to four lanes between the City of Quincy to Interstate 90.

5. Payment for Transportation Planning Study. The total cost for the transportation planning study is \$252,923. CDTC currently has a consultant under contract to perform the transportation planning study. CDTC, CDRPA, the City of Quincy, and the Port of Quincy agree to share in the total cost in the following amounts:

- CDTC: not to exceed \$232,923
- **CDRPA:** \$10,000
- **City of Quincy:** \$5,000
- Port of Quincy: \$5,000

The cost sharing limitations set forth above shall not be exceeded without the written authorization of all Participating Entities. CDTC will invoice CDRPA, City of Quincy and Port of Quincy within 30 days of making a final payment to the contracted consultant upon completion of work. CDRPA, City of Quincy and Port of Quincy each agree to pay its established share within 30 days of invoice. Payment(s) not made within 30 days of invoice shall accrue interest at the rate of 12% per annum.

6. Authority. Each person signing this Agreement has the full authority to execute this Agreement and to bind the party on behalf of which he/she signed.

7. Applicable Law. The law of the State of Washington shall govern this Agreement and all questions relating to it.

8. Venue. Venue of any action arising out of this Agreement shall be exclusively in a court of competent jurisdiction in Douglas County, Washington.

9. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which together shall be deemed one and the same document.

10. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between CDTC, CDRPA, City of Quincy and the Port of Quincy relating to the transportation planning study. 

Re: Pangborn Industrial Park – Revised Land Lease Rates

The current land lease rate at Pangborn Airport Business Park is \$0.25 per square foot per year. So, to lease an acre of property is \$10,890 per year, plus State Leasehold Tax at \$12.84.

During the past several years industrial property sales in Douglas County have been increasing. Ron Cridlebaugh has done an analysis of property sales which you can find attached.

Ron and I believe the land lease rate at Pangborn Airport Business Park needs to be increased. Our recommendation is in the range between \$0.32 to \$0.35 per square foot per year. This equates to \$13,939 to \$15,246 per acre per year.

A revised land lease rate would impact new tenants, not existing tenants.


